
Focus on Saturn

- Saturn in opposition (closest to Earth) on 21 September
- Saturn's rings at maximum brightness (Seeliger effect).
- Friday night only: Titan transits in front of Saturn!

Titan Shadow Transit July 2, 2025 Joe Izen


